Paddlewheeler *Yellowstone* on the San Bernard River



The *YellowStone* is a 72-foot paddlewheeler, an authentic stern wheeler, powered by a Perkins diesel engine which turns the paddle wheel at a leisurely ten miles per hour. She is certified by the U.S. Coast Guard for 35 passengers.

During the hour and half cruise, you can spend time relaxing and shore watching at a leisurely pace. The San Bernard River zigzags across the coastal plains with an air of enchantment. Rural and regional, hidden in the shadow of the celebrated Brazos, it eluded large populations for years and was still pristine long into the 20th century, when other rivers were polluted. Now strings of homes can be spotted along the banks along with varied species of plant and bird life.

The *YellowStone* is named after an Early-American Steamboat that played a major role in the War for Texas Independence when she ferried Sam Houston's troops across the Brazos to fight General Santa Anna at the battle of San Jacinto. And, a few months later when Stephen F. Austin died, carried his body to its final resting place at Peach Point Plantation between the towns of Brazoria and Freeport.

Private cruises are by appointment and subject to weather conditions. She is docked next to Dido's Restaurant on the San Bernard River.
